6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

Vision

To build the monument of a society free of discrimination, prosperous with moral uprightness, cultured and self-reliant, through spreading higher education among the socially and economically backward people of the greater Barbhag region and thereby creating a cosmopolitan attitude among them is the vision of Barbhag College.

Mission:

- To plan for action to achieve the pre-determined vision of developing the college as a premier institution of higher education in Nalbari district.
- To maintain healthy academic atmosphere through effective teaching learning and extension activities among teachers and students.
- To create a competitive environment among students that will enable them for better means of livelihood by employment in both public and private sector or in self-employed management.
- To enlighten the learners with relevant knowledge and equipping them for developing their level of competence which will contribute effectively to nation building through leadership, teaching and self-conscious citizenship.
- To help the people of surrounding area in social mobilization and the improvement of their socio-economic base by involving them in various institutional activities and other forms of community interactions.
- To create a wide range of knowledge base among the learners on contemporary at the same time important issues, like environment, culture, human rights, ethical values, youth unrest, professional ethics etc.
- To create a sense of social harmony by organising different activities of national importance and instil a sense of unity and brotherhood among the students.

6.2 Does the Institution have a management Information System

Yes, Barbhag College has adopted effective management information system that helps in the management of the college. The apex body of the college i.e. the Governing Body comprises of the President, the Principal, nominees of the affiliated University, teachers' nominees, non-teaching staff nominees, student guardian members and all the crucial decisions taken in the Governing Body are circulated by the Principal and also by the nominees among the teaching and non-teaching staff. The Principal discusses different issues by holding meeting with the teaching and non-teaching staff from time to time and other notices through his order book. The college has developed committee system for effectively manage the administration. For the academic management, there are committees like admission committee, Academic Council, Examination Council, Library Committee etc. that include members from both teaching and non-teaching staff and all the important notices

are circulated through the notice books maintained by each committee. The Academic Council chaired by the Principal make strategy for every academic session including new admission, conduct of classes, coverage of syllabus, conduct of internal examinations etc. with the approval of the Governing Body and the detail information is made public through college website, notice board etc.

Regarding the financial management of the college, all the decisions are taken by the Governing Body and any kind of construction and purchase is done by the respective committees that include both teaching and non-teaching staff. To convey important notices to student, the college utilises the notice board service. In this way, management information system is well maintained in the college so that everybody is well informed about the management of the college.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Being an affiliated college to Gauhati University, Barbhag College enjoys very little scope in curriculum development as it is bound to follow the curriculum designs followed by the affiliated University. However, the college provides suggestions from time to time to the Academic Registrar of the Gauhati University to incorporate changes in the syllabus. In the current session too, the Academic Council of the college took resolution to suggest changes to the Academic Registrar of Gauhati University about the Honours course syllabus of political Science and sent the application thereby.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Barbhag College has adopted teaching learning strategy for the fulfilment of academic goals of the institute. For the teaching learning, the teachers use the traditional lecture method with the use of blackboard, chalk etc. however, to engage the students in the academic activities, they are given home assignments, projects etc. Different departments organise class seminar for the students so that they can express their views on the discussed topic.

The library of the College play important role among students. With the collection of vast number of books, students are encouraged to visit the library and acquaint themselves with different knowledge.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Barbhag College strictly follows the rules and regulations set forth by Gauhati University both in the external and internal examinations. For the internal Assessment, sessional examinations are conducted and marks are given on the basis of the Examinations, Group Discussions, Home Assignments and Seminar. External examiners are invited to evaluate the project where presentation of the project reports by the students before the panel is mandatory.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Barbhag College takes initiative for the research and development activities among the faculty members of the college. In this current session, Dr. Dhaneswar Baishya (Associate Professor of Department of Political Science), Dr. Karuna Baruah (Associate Professor of department of Mathematics), Dr. Rantu Moni (Assistant Professor of Department of Zoology) and Susanta Kashyap (Assitant Professor, Department of Economics) have completed UGC sponsored Minor Research Projects in this session.

Regarding doctoral degree, no faculty have achieved PhD degree in this session.

The college has organised a training programme for the non-teaching staff on "Basic Computer Applications for E-Office and Management of Barbhag College" on 16th September, 2017

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Library, ICT and Physical infrastructural development during academic session of 2017-2018 can be shown as under:

- Before the session 2017-2018, the Library of Barbhag College had 30247 text and reference books, more than 199500 e-Books with N-List subscription, 4 journals and more than 6000 E-Journal with N-List Subscription. In this current session, the Library added 1003 new Text Books and Reference Books and 1 new journal. Therefore, the total numbers of Text Books and Reference Books available in the Library are 31,250, total numbers of journals are 5 and CD and Video are 1100.
- There is no ICT and physical infrastructure development carried out in this session.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Barbhag College utilises the human resource of the institute to bring the qualities latent in them. This can be summed up as under:

- The college manages the teaching staff not only in teaching but also in other activities like research works, social and extension activities, teaching-learning evaluation etc. They are members to different committees and duly responsible for the duties assigned to them.
- Again, the non-teaching staffs of the college participate in different functions associated with different committees and in college management in addition to the regular duties assigned to them.
- Another important component of college human resource, the students also participate in different curricular and co-curricular activities of the college. The college organises different competitions for the students to show their talents.
- The college organises training programmes for the Faculty and non-faculty members for capacity building and professional development.
- In 2017-2018, the IQAC of Barbhag College has organised a training programme for the non-teaching staff on "Basic Computer Applications for E-Office and Management of Barbhag College" on 16th September, 2017.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

- The recruitment of Faculty and Staff is done according to the rules and regulations of the Director of Higher Education, Government of Assam.
- For the recruitment of contractual teachers, the Governing Body takes the decision and appoints
 them from the time to time on the basis of need for the smooth functioning of the academic
 session.

For the admission of students, the college follows the following procedure:

- For the admission of new students for the coming academic session, the Academic Council
 chaired by the Principal takes decisions about the numbers of students to be admitted,
 reservation of seats, date of admission, selection of students etc and circulated the decisions
 in the college.
- The date of the admission process is duly notified in the college notice board and also in college website.
- After this, the Admission Committee scrutinises the applications and analyses the profiles
 of the students for different courses and prepare the lists of probable students for each
 course on merit basis. Here, the Reservation Policy of the Govt. of India is strictly followed
 in the time of admission.

The college has also Fee waived for the students having below Rs. 1,00,000/- annual income as per the rule of the Government.

6.4 Welfare schemes for Teaching, Non-teaching and Students

Academic Year: 2017-18

Barbhag College is affiliated to Gauhati University and follows the curriculum recommended by the university. The College ensures that the curriculum transaction is an organized process to continue the standard of teaching-learning process of the College. The College has a specific feedback mechanism for the improvement of the academic atmosphere. The IQAC of Barbhag College evolved a devised structured questionnaire where formal offline feedbacks on the curriculum and its transaction are obtained basically from teachers and students.

Process of Feedback:

• Students: Student's feedback is taken at the end of final semester classes.

Details of Analysis of Feedback


During the academic session 2017-18 a total number of 945 students were studying in the final semester classes of BA and BSc programme and the feedback form on syllabus and its transaction has been distributed offline to the student out of which 20 percent responded to it that is 200 feedback forms on curriculum returned and the basis of the response given by students it has come to light that most of the students expresses satisfaction at the syllabus of the Gauhati University. But there is a marked improvement in respect of responding to the feedback system by the students. The response of the students has been found in the following manner.

Best Practice-I



1. Title of the Practice:

Women Empowerment Programme

- 2. Goal: Barbhag College believes in gender justice and empowerment inside the campus and tries to extend its effort towards gender sensitisation, boosting dignity of women folk as well as empowering them physically, mentally, socially and economically etc.
- 3. **The Context:** The College is situated in the rural area of Nalbari district of Assam where women folk are comparatively less empowered and are marginalised. Simultaneously, the number of girl students is more as compared to that of boys in the College and most of the girl students come from the remote areas and belong to poor families. So, to empower girl students and women folk of the neighbouring community, the College has been taking various initiatives in this regard.
- 4. **The Practice:** This practice was introduced in the college in the year 2012. A permanent body by the name of Women Cell was formed and it has been performing activities like awareness programme, lecture programme, various competition, health camp, public meetings, workshop etc. This year the following programmes were conducted—(a) workshop and lecture on protection and safety of women on 20-06-2017; (b) health awareness programme at Dokoha High school in celebrating the International Women's Day on 08-03-2018.
- 5. Evidence of Success: we have observed the following positive impacts of this practice among the students, parents and neighbouring community— (a) Increasing enrolment of girl students; (b) active participation of girl student in the academic and co-curricular activities of College is increasing; (c) the success rate of girl students in examinations and other activities has increased.
- 6. **Problems encountered and Resources Required:** Due to paucity of fund, it sometimes becomes difficult to organise different activities outside the college campus and other skill based empowerment programme for further development of the girl students and the women folk in the neighbourhood.

1. Title of the Practice:

Best Reader Awards

- 2. **Goal:** To motivate the students for inculcating reading habit in themselves, this award was introduced in the College.
- 3. **The Context:** This award is being given to the students who regularly visit the central library of our institution and use the library judiciously and have excelled in academic field..
- 4. **The Practice:** Two best readers, one from male and another one from female students are selected for the Award. The Award is sponsored by the Library of the College
- 5. **Evidence of Success:** This practice has improved the reading habit of the students and the number of students using library resources has been increasing day by day.
