

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

“Einstein’s Theory of Relativity”
Date: 20-09-2018**

Resource Person: Dr. Mahendra Kalita

A seminar on “Einstein’s Theory of Relativity” was organized by the department of Physics, Barbhag College in the conference hall on 20-09-2018. The aim of the seminar was to enlighten the students on the greatest contribution of Einstein to the world of Physics. The programme was inaugurated by Pulama Talukdar, Assistant Professor Department of Physics, Barbhag College at 2:00pm. In her inaugural talk she briefly discussed the life history of the great scientist and threw light on his different contributions to the world of Physics. She just introduced students to the term ‘Relativity’. As a resource person, Dr. Mahendra Kalita, Associate Professor, Department of Physics, Rangia College introduced students to both the theories- General Relativity and Special relativity. He told that general relativity is actually Einstein’s Theory of gravity and it says that the observed gravitational effect between two masses results from their warping of space-time. The time dependent solutions of general relativity enable us to talk about the history of the universe. Einstein’s theory has the prediction of Black holes, gravitational lensing and existence of gravitational waves. In addition, general relativity has provided the base of cosmological models of an expanding universe. He also beautifully discussed the special relativity .He said that combined with the other laws of physics, the two postulates of special relativity predicts the equivalence of mass and energy as expressed in the mass energy equivalence formula. He concluded his lecture saying special relativity as the most accurate model of motion at any speed or especially at a speed close to that of light. The seminar was attended by 27 students and 03 teachers of the department. The lecture of the resource person was followed by an interaction session where all the students and teachers participated actively. The programme ended with the Vote of Thanks delivered by Mahananda Pathak,HOD, Physics Barbhag College.

Seminar on Intellectual Property Right

Date-10/12/2018

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Barbhag College has organised a one-day interdisciplinary seminar on Intellectual Property rights (IPR) on 10th December 2018. At the beginning of the Seminar, the Keynote address was given by Dr. Karuna Baruah, HOD, Mathematics Department of Barbhag College and the welcome address was given by Hemanta Deka, Assistant coordinator, IQAC, Barbhag College. Dr. Bipul Kalita Associate Professor of Assamese department chaired the sessions of the seminar.

Prof. Mahananda Pathak, Assistant professor, department Physics of Barbhag College, is invited as resource person of the seminar. Mahananda Pathak has discussed the theoretical background of Intellectual Property Rights especially patent and copy right. Describing Intellectual Property, he said that the intellectual properties are those things that are created in mind and expressed in some form or other. It must have the proof of ownership and should be recognised under the act of law. He talked about the rights enjoyed by people under intellectual property, like rights to enjoy the owner of an intellectual property, right to exploit, license, assign, surrender etc as the owner. He also mentioned about different acts which protects the intellectual property such as- The Patent Act (1970), The Design Act (2000), The Trademark Act (1999), and The Geographical Indications of Goods (Registration and Protection act, 1999) etc. He said that the copyright procedure in India is maintained by the Copyright Act of 1957. He mentioned that people can cite other's works with proper acknowledgement and prior permission of the owner of the copyright for research or private study, for reporting current events and in connection with judicial proceedings. A total of 45 participants from various colleges took part in this Seminar and made it a huge success.

The vote of thanks is offered by Dr. Biplab Deka, Associate professor, Department of Economics, and thanks everybody for their presence and patient hearing. The seminar comes to an end with an optimistic note.



On 24.01.2019, Wednesday, the Dept. of Political Science of Barbhag College organized a class seminar among the students of the department at the departmental honours room. The topic of the class seminar was "Globalization and State: Current Challenges". Mr. Niren Malakar, Associate Professor of the Dept. of Political Science of Barbhag College was present in this class seminar as resource person.

Mr. Niren Malakar, in his speech, discussed about the challenges faced by the sovereign states at the time of globalization. At first, he discussed the term of globalization as a process of multifaceted phenomenon that includes mainly trade and investment, liberalization, technological innovation and the entrepreneurship and global social network etc. it has many aspects, like economic, political, social and cultural etc that increases interconnectedness at global level. Talking about the connection between globalization and state, Mr. Niren Malakar said that the process of globalization has severely affected the nation states and their authority. In the economic sphere, it has withdrawn state authority to control market forces. All the major financial international institutions like WTO, World Bank, IMF etc have been controlling global economy. The TNCs and the MNCs have control over the economy of different countries. It has mainly affected the economy of the developing countries, where the problems like unemployment, poverty have been increasing day by day. Mr. Niren Malakar, also talked about the impact of globalization on state authority to direct and to control their economy and to influence political system of the country. In the political field, international developments affect country's ability to formulate and implement policies. At the same time, Mr. Niren Malakar also talked about cultural globalization, western cultural tradition, western values, western bureaucratic organizations, which are adopted by the developing countries, undermined the peculiar culture of those countries. Thus, Mr. Niren Malakar enlightened the students with his vast knowledge on the seminar topic.

Mr. Niren Malakar, also participated in an interactive session with the students. In this class seminar, Jintu Kalita, Student of the department of Political science presented a paper titled "Globalisation and India". Thus, the seminar ended in a positive way.



**CLASS SEMINAR
ON
FEDERALISM AND INDIAN EXPERIENCES**

**Organized By
Department of Political Science**

Date: 20/04/2019

Venue: Honours Classroom

On 20/04/2019, Saturday, a class seminar was organized by the Department of Political science of Barbhag College among the honours students of the department. The topic for the class seminar was “Federalism and Indian Experiences” and the resource person of the class seminar was Mr. HementaDeka, HOD and Associate Professor of the Political Science Department.

Mr. HemantaDeka, started his speech by addressing and introducing the topic of the class seminar to the students. He explained the term ‘federalism’ as a form of government in which two separate governments rule-one at the center and the other at the federating units or regional level. A true federalism, to Mr. Deka is the example of constitutional division of powers between the two governments and both the governments enjoy separate powers. They act independently in their own sphere. Mr. HemantaDeka, then talked about the Indian experiences with federalism. He described it as “Centralized Federalism”. In this power-division and relation, the central government enjoys more powers over the state governments. The provisions of power-division between the center and the states in the Constitution of India make the center more powerful and more authoritative. The lists of power division between the center and states, unified judiciary are the examples of the presence of strong central government in India.

Mr. HemantaDeka, then talked about the problems associated with Indian federalism. To Him, regionalism is the main challenging issue of federalism. It encourages the people of different regions who are deprived of different facilities to revolt against the central government. Thus, the nation has to face internal security challenges in terms of growing destructive activities.

Mr. HemantaDeka, also identified central planning as a challenge towards federalism in India. The provision of separate constitution for Jammu and Kashmir is also violating the federal character of the Indian Constitution. In this way, Mr. HemantaDeka enlightened the students with his knowledge on the seminar topic.

BidishaLahkar, student of the Political Science Department presented a paper titled “Indian Federalism: Constitutional Provisions” in this class seminar. Thus, the class seminar ended in a positive note.


